

Make-up for Choir

Any absence from class or rehearsal requires making up. It is best to sing or play because that is the most useful and a real reflection of what you missed. However, if you have no piano or resource to practice – write a paper. When practicing, you must make up one-half of the time missed. For example, if you miss a two hour class you need to practice for one hour, etc. A parent signature is required if you practiced at home to verify the time you put in. Mrs. Garrett will sign the ones completed at school.

Use the internet, encyclopedia or library for your research. Include their birth/death dates, the major events of their life, and the impact of their music on the world. Paper should be typed, double spaced and three paragraphs.
